- Completion of NVQ level 7 (Equivalent to bachelor's degree in SLQF) with relevant work experience in Development as determined by the Faculty Board and Senate of the University;
 AND
- ► A good knowledge of the English language and satisfactory performance at a selection test/ selection interview.
